



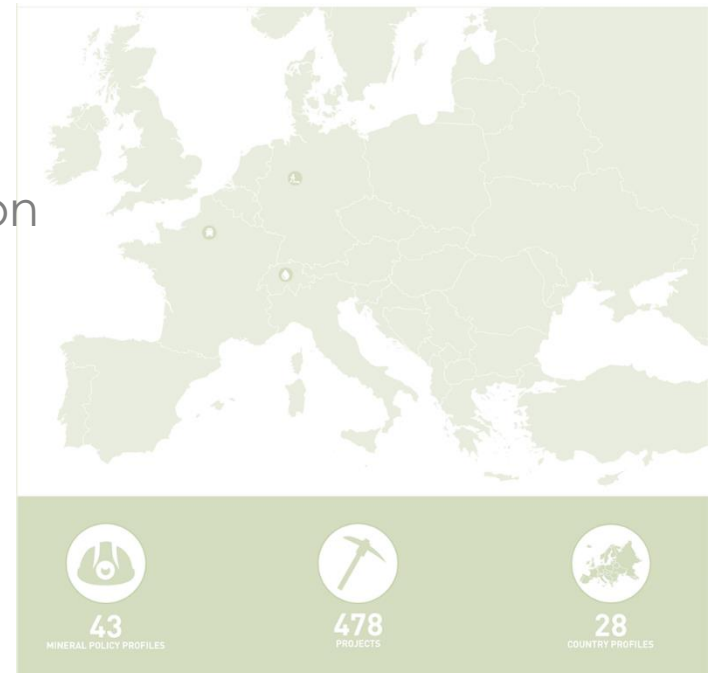

What's expected of the Guide?

- Provide guidance for mineral policy by developing a knowledge repository which will:
 1. Achieve **greater transparency** of EU and MS policy and legislation.
 2. Outlining the EU MS minerals policy **governance framework**.
 3. Facilitating **policy learning** between EU MS
 4. Contributing to **coherence** in the minerals policy sector
 5. Providing a favourable framework for the implementation of the **EIP on Raw Materials**

- To achieve these ambitious objectives we will deliver:
 - a web-based knowledge repository of policy and legislation
 - benchmarking and good practice
 - fit-for-purpose for different stakeholder groups
 - whole chain of mining activities

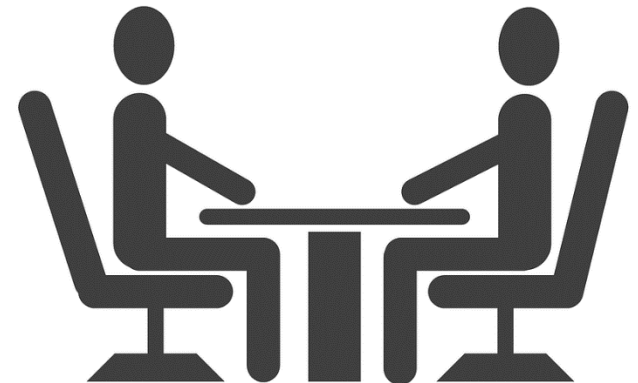
What we've done so far

Deliverable 1.2 on website

➤ Interviews with users

➤ *Sources of info already used*

- Ad hoc communication with colleagues & contacts
 - Reliant on existing contacts
- **Customers – provide requirements/constraints**
 - Reactive
- **Fraser Institute Annual Survey**
 - Why is this trusted/valued?
- **National gov and EU websites**
 - Details but not accessible
- **Trade associations**
 - Only for members?





What we've done so far

Deliverable 1.2 on website

➤ Interviews with users

➤ *Types of info wanted*

➤ Comparisons

➤ On specific details, e.g. of licences

➤ News and updates

➤ Analysis – e.g. where 'regulatory competition'

➤ *Views on planned structure (country, good practise, value chain)*

➤ No 'big' missing gaps

➤ *View on formats*

➤ User friendly website, PDFs for down and printing, but no exporting of data (i.e. xls etc)

What we've done so far

Deliverable 2.1 on website

➤ Stock taking of EU and MS policy and legislation

- Detailed stock taking on policy & legislation at EU and MS level
- Desk-research compilation of 1 EU and 28 EU MS mineral policy country profiles
- 15 / 29 (28 MS + EU) validated by policy maker
- 13 / 28 policy governance processes and mechanisms outlined

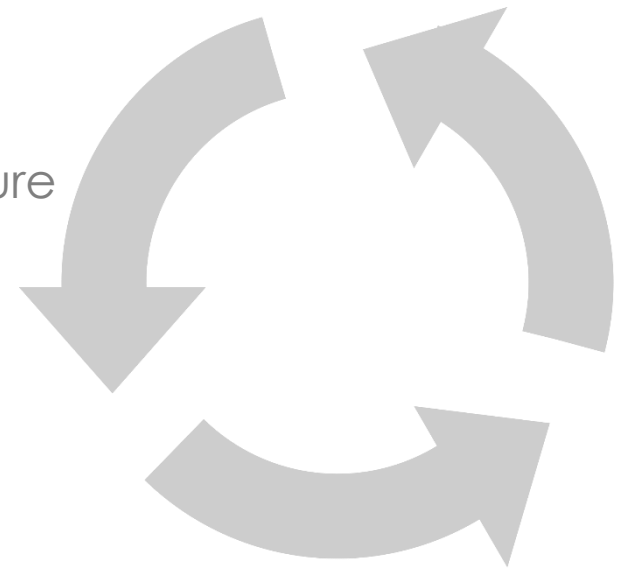
- Stock-taking on policy & legislation will be expanded and , where necessary, more detailed as the project advances.
 - *[i.e. WP 3-5 will add information]*





Where we're aiming

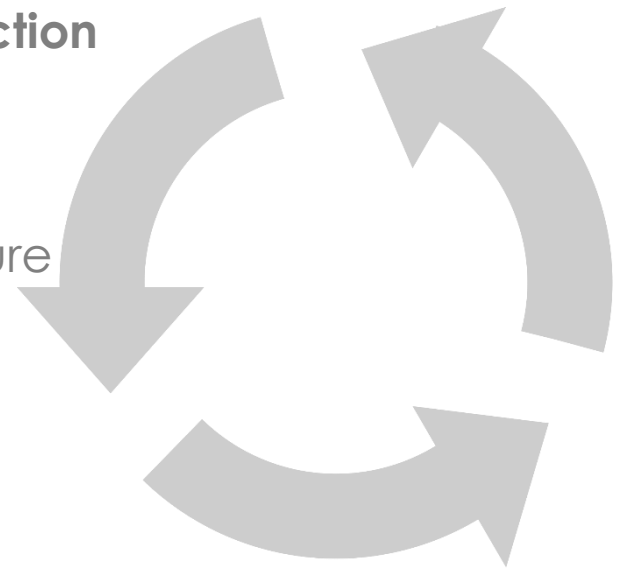
- **First iteration of proposed structure**
 - Data on legislation and policy **country by country**
 - Each MS
 - Data on broken down by **each stage in the value chain**
 - Exploration and extraction
 - Processing
 - Waste management and mine closure
 - Data and stats – standardisation
 - **Good practice** examples
 - Policies that promote innovation
 - Industry examples of innovation?





Where we're aiming

- **How will the structure evolve**
 - **Policy Labs and conferences user input**
 - 5 labs throughout the project
 - Present prototype and gather feedback at all
 - **As each value chain section kicks into action**
 1. Exploration and extraction
 2. Processing
 3. Waste management and mine closure
 - **Updates by project team**
 - **Constraints**
 - Deep analysis not feasible
